COUNCIL ACTIONS:

Motion was made by Mr. Schlauch & seconded by Mr. Roessler to adopt Resolution 984-24, approving a five-year renewal of a Cable TV Franchise Agreement with Verizon Pennsylvania LLC. Unanimously approved.
