Motion was made by Mr. Dell, seconded by Mr. Vento, to authorize a fund transfer of \$190,651.29 from the Developer's Escrow Fund to the Capital Improvement Fund. Unanimously approved.

Motion was made by Mr. Dell, seconded by Mr. Szarmach, to table the adoption of the 2017 Budget pending a re-advertisement of the Real Estate Tax Ordinance. Unanimously approved.

Motion was made by Mr. Dell, seconded by Mr. Szarmach, to re-advertise Ordinance No. 908-16, setting the Real Estate Tax Millage at 4.78 mills or approximate mills. Unanimously approved.

Motion was made by Mr. Dell, seconded by Mr. Anderson, to adopt Ordinance No. 909-16, setting the rate for the Local Services Tax at \$52 per person per year for 2017. Unanimously approved.

Motion was made by Mr. Dell, seconded by Mr. Seitz, to adopt Ordinance No. 910-16, setting the Earned Income Tax rate at 1% for 2017. Unanimously approved.

Motion was made by Mr. Dell, seconded by Mr. Szarmach, to authorize the staff to open up a checking account at Standard Bank for the new EMS Fund. Unanimously approved.

Motion was made by Mr. Seitz, seconded by Mr. Majernik, to approve a work agreement with A. Liberoni Construction for the removal of approximately 30,000 cubic yards of soil at the new Municipal Building. Unanimously approved.

MAYOR'S REPORT

Mayor Hrivnak thanked Dave Johnson of Erie Insurance for providing a Thanksgiving meal to the police officers on duty during the holiday. Mayor Hrivnak reported Officers attended the Regional HOPE Summit related to the opioid epidemic; the ATS radar speed display was deployed to three areas during the month; there were 923 calls for service; SRO Little coordinated with Buckle Up PA to present a distracted driving program for students at Plum High School; and all officers completed firearms training and the department received AAA's Platinum Award for Community Traffic Safety for the fifth consecutive year.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Intergovernmental Cooperative Committee with Plum School District - No report.

Finance Committee – Mr. Dell reported they have tabled the budget approval due to several revisions. Mr. Dell said Plum is one of the fastest growing communities in Allegheny County and it is important to address the needs of our current residents along with those of future residents.

Personnel and Management - No report.

Roads, Equipment and Grounds – Mr. Seitz asked residents to be mindful of snow emergency parking signs allowing a clear path for plow trucks.

Public Safety - No report.

Planning and Economic Development – Mr. Vento reported that 56 permits were issued last month generating a total of \$22,476 with the majority being building permits.
