### CHAPTER 12 IMPLEMENTATION STRATEGIES

Implementing the recommendations of the Plum Borough Comprehensive Plan will require many years. The following matrix of implementing steps provides a schedule of short-term, middle-term, long-term and ongoing actions.

**Short-term** recommendations should generally be initiated, if not completed, within one to three years; **middle-term** recommendations should be initiated within four to six years. **Long-term** recommendations will generally require seven or more years to complete. **Ongoing** phases are continuous.
